## Salvation

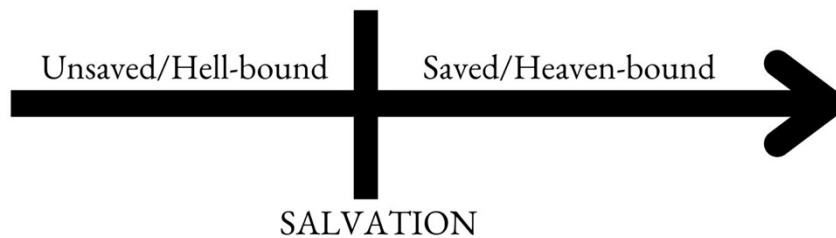
There is no sin outside of Jesus' ability to \_\_\_\_\_.

\_\_\_\_\_, if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts.

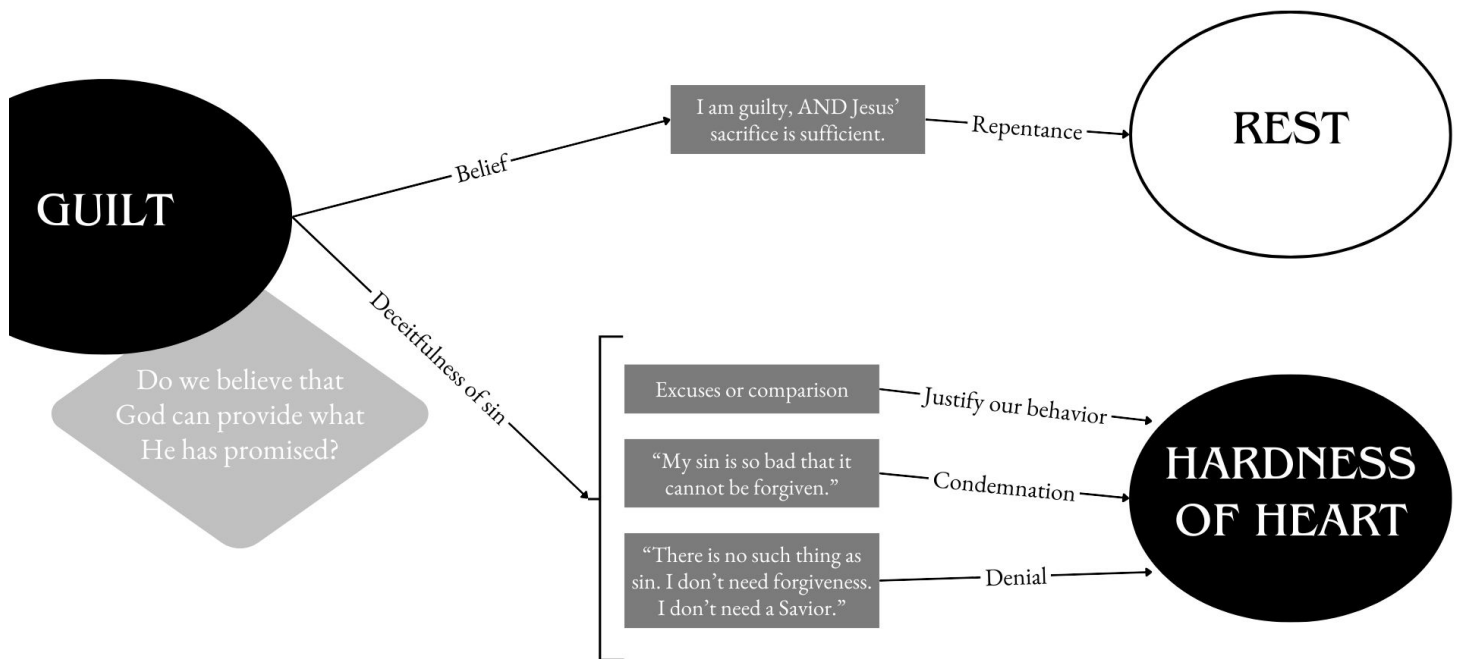
The Israelites didn't believe that God would \_\_\_\_\_ what He had \_\_\_\_\_.
